

🏌️ Tips for Ready Golf 🏌️

- Keep your pre-shot routine short.
- Alert playing partners when speed of play becomes an issue.
- Be ready to play when it's your turn; take multiple clubs around the greens or when away from your cart.
- Try to follow the flight of all shots, not just your own. If you already know the location of your shot, hit your ball first, then help look for any lost balls. Volunteer to fill in a divot or rake a bunker for another player if needed. Be ready to attend the flagstick for others.
- If you are in the lead cart at the tee box, you should tee off first. You can then drive to your ball after the last player has hit and not have to wait for them to walk back to their cart.
- Keep up with the group in front of you. Your correct position on the course is immediately behind the group in front of you, not immediately in front of the group behind you.
- If you are driving, drop the passenger off at her ball and drive to your ball. If you are the passenger, don't wait for the driver to pick you up. Continue walking down the hole until she catches up with you.
- Record scores at the next tee, not at the green.
- Mark your ball and lift and clean it when you arrive at the putting green, so you are ready to replace it when it is your turn to play.
- Line up your putt while others are putting as long as you are not disturbing the player putting.
